

The King's Own Calgary Regiment (RCAC) Trooper Tommy Baker Snortin' Norton Award 2024

The Award



In 2020, the year which marked the 75th anniversary of The King's Own Calgary Regiment completing service in the Second World War, Trooper (ret'd) Tommy Baker established an award to be presented annually to a student who is a serving member either of The King's Own Calgary Regiment, of the 2512 King's Own RCACC, or of the 1910 Pte Pattison, VC RCACC, and who will be commencing or continuing their education at the post-secondary level. The award is named after despatch rider Trooper Tommy Baker and his "snortin" Norton" motorcycle.

Tommy joined the Regiment in February of 1941, and following Armoured Fighting Vehicle (AFV) training in Camp Borden, arrived in the United Kingdom on July 1st of that year. On 19 August 1942, Tommy took part in the Dieppe Raid, but he was one of the lucky ones who made it back to England that day. The following summer, in July 1943, Tommy landed with the Regiment in Italy, and there assumed the role of despatch rider. During the battle of Motta Montecorvino, on 01 October 1943, two days before his 20th birthday, Tommy was riding his Norton motorcycle, and leading the regimental physician, Doc Alexander, to the location of injured regimental personnel, when he was blown off his vehicle by a German 88. Tommy was severely wounded and would spend the next six months convalescing in hospital, as well as being retrained, before returning to the Regiment - just in time for the fourth Battle of Monte Cassino, in May of 1944. Tommy continued to serve with the Regiment throughout Canada's Italian campaign, and then into Northwest Europe, until the end of the war. Tommy passed away on December 11th, 2021, in Red Deer, Alberta.

The award is valued at \$2,000, and is to be applied towards the cost of tuition at any accredited postsecondary institution in Alberta. The award will be presented to the student who best exemplifies the valiant and intrepid character of Tommy Baker, and his qualities of brave and informed decision making, ownership of outcomes, inspirational leadership, and being a provider of results. The successful candidate will be a hard-charging team player who is accountable, lifts the spirits of his or her colleagues with his or her own positive attitude and good humour, and who leads by inspiring loyalty, rather than by imposing authority.

Who is Eligible?

- a) The applicant must be a serving member of The King's Own Calgary Regiment, or a Cadet Instructor Cadre Officer or a cadet in either the 2512 King's Own RCACC, or the 1910 Pte Pattison, VC RCACC;
- b) The applicant must be a graduating high school student who will be enrolling, or a student who is already enrolled, in an accredited post-secondary institution in Alberta, in a full-time program that will lead to a degree, diploma or certificate. Full time is considered to be a minimum of three (3) credit earning courses per semester, and a minimum of two (2) semesters per year;
- c) The applicant must have attained a minimum of 65%, or a 2.6 grade point average, measured over all courses listed on the transcript for their most recently completed academic semester; and
- d) If a student withdraws from their academic year of studies, they are no longer eligible for the award and any monies issued must be returned in full to The King's Own Calgary Regiment (50 CEF / 14 CTR) Association.

Application Deadline

The deadline to apply is 15 April 2024.

Applications

The following documentation is required to be submitted:

- a) Applicant's most recent student transcript or Detailed Academic Report;
- b) Military Letter of Reference as detailed in the Selection Committee Evaluation Criteria (below);
- c) Applicant's essay as detailed in the Selection Committee Evaluation Criteria (below); and
- d) Proof of acceptance into an accredited post-secondary institution in Alberta, or proof of existing enrollment in same. Note that in the case of a graduating high school student, presentation of the award may be delayed until the successful applicant has received and provided proof of acceptance into the institution.

Submissions, including the attached application form and all supporting documentation, shall be tendered via e-mail to The King's Own Calgary Regiment (50 CEF / 14 CTR) Association at kocalgrassociation@gmail.com,

Selection Committee Evaluation Criteria

The following will be used as guidelines for the competitive selection of a deserving applicant. Note that in the case of two applicants with equally compelling applications, preference will be given to a high school graduate over a student who is already enrolled in a post-secondary institution.

a) Academic Achievement (65%):

The applicant's most recent student transcript showing academic performance, which as stated above must indicate a minimum 65% or 2.6 grade point average. A "Detailed Academic Report" from the Alberta Education myPass website that can be downloaded at no cost is acceptable;

b) Military Letter of Reference* (25%):

A letter of reference from a military supervisor confirming the applicant's status with the Regiment or Cadet Corps, and describing the applicant's demonstrated qualities as detailed in the award description on page 1 of this document. The letter is to include remarks regarding the applicant's participation in Regiment/Corps training and exercises, as well as their enthusiasm for military service. The letter should also reference how the candidate exemplifies the valiant and intrepid character of Tommy Baker, and his qualities of brave and informed decision making, ownership of outcomes, inspirational leadership, and being a provider of results. Lastly, the letter should describe how the applicant fits the criteria of a hard-charging team player who is accountable, lifts the spirits of his or her colleagues with his or her own positive attitude and good humour, and who leads by inspiring loyalty, rather than by imposing authority; and

c) Applicant's Essay (10%):

An essay of up to 500 words (one page, single spaced) summarizing the applicant's regimental involvement relating to the applicant's demonstrated qualities as detailed in the award description, and how they plan to use those qualities in their future careers, as well as why they believe they would be a good choice to receive the award.

*It is recommended that the candidate provide their military supervisor with a copy of the criteria in order to better enable the supervisor to comment on the criteria as they relate to the candidate.

Confirmation of Receipt

If you wish to be notified that your application has been received, please check off the appropriate box on the application. If you have checked off the box, but do not receive a confirmation, you must contact kocalgrassociation@gmail.com at least one week prior to the deadline date. No exceptions will be made for misdirected applications.

Announcement and Notification of Award

The recipient of the award will be notified prior to St. George's weekend, 2024. If the winner of the award has not yet provided proof of acceptance into a post-secondary institution in Alberta, the award may be withheld until such proof has been provided.
